Conservation Corner: "Spring" into Water-Wise Gardening!

With the change in seasons upon us, here are some springtime tips to help you maximize your water efficiency:

- Now is a good time to turn on and test sprinklers (because you've had them off during the rain), and flush out the drip systems.
- If you're planning to add California Friendly and Native plants to your garden, make sure to get it done before spring ends.
- Spring is a good time to freshen up the mulch in your garden. Natural mulch reduces moisture loss in soil, helps prevent weed growth, and puts the finishing touch in a California Friendly garden.

Your Water is High Quality

Public water agencies are required to provide to their customers annual Consumer Confidence Reports (CCRs) - also known as Water Quality Report - that detail local water quality information. The reports are prepared in accordance with state and federal



regulations and include reliable information about the sources of drinking water supplies.
