**Description:** The Reservoir Upgrades Project has several components to increase the efficiency and reliability of Reservoirs 1 and 2: Chemical storage and feed systems (sodium hypochlorite and aqueous ammonia) to help reduce nitrification issues in the distribution system; Pump replacement and conversion of drivers from gas engines to electrical motors; Upgrades to reservoir electrical service through SCE; Installation of diesel generator systems to power the reservoirs in the event of an emergency; Miscellaneous system rehabilitation and upgrades including electrical gear replacement, pipeline rehabilitation, pipeline modifications, and instrument replacement based on the results of site visits and related analyses; and Slurry Dewatering Pit upgrades located at the Reservoir 1 site.

**Status:** Following the approval of the recommendations of the Water, Power, and Supply Chain Reliability Assessment, Mesa Water developed a design Scope of Work for the Reservoirs 1 and 2 Upgrades Project. A proposal was solicited from a CIPR on-call design consultant and the project's Preliminary and Final Design was kicked off in May 2021. The consultant delivered a draft version of Technical Memorandum No.1 – Reservoir 1 Site Master Plan and the draft Permit Plan in July 2021. Following Mesa Water's review of TM1 and the Permit Plan, the consultant began work on the Preliminary Design Report. The Preliminary Design Report was delivered in November 2021 and the Preliminary Design Report Workshop was held in September 2021. In March 2023, the Final Bid documents and cost estimate were received and reviewed by staff. After receiving approval for the project's reduced scope, the project team began modifying the Bid Documents. The revised Bid Documents were received in August 2023. Request for Bids were released to the prequalified contractors in August 2023. A job walk was conducted in August 2023 and attended by five prequalified contractors. The bid opening was held in October 2023. Four bids were received. A recommendation for contract time extension negotiation and award was approved November 2023. The contract time extension negotiation to accommodate equipment lead times was completed and Notice to Proceed was provided January 2024. A preconstruction meeting and a site walk with the contractor team were held February 2024. The construction team mobilized at Reservoir 2 in June 2024 and Reservoir 1 in October 2024. The contractor installed and started new mixers in Reservoir 2 in August 2024. At Reservoir 2, the contractor poured and coated the concrete foundation for the Reservoir chemical facility and constructed yard piping and electrical. The chemical tanks were delivered in August 2025 and anchored to the chemical pads. Work is stopped due to the impacts of the contractor-installed pipeline break at Reservoir 2 on October 18, 2025. The initial forensic site investigation was completed in November 2025. Testing and repair of the

damaged equipment is in process. The Contractor's insurance representatives are scheduled to inspect the damage on January 21, 2026. The pumps and motors are expected in March 2026; however, the variable frequency drives were destroyed in the October 18, 2025 incident. At Reservoir 1, the contractor has demolished yard structures, excavated for the new Heavy Equipment Port, Slurry Dewatering Pit, Chemical Facility, and Generator Pads. The Slurry Dewatering Pit went into operation in April 2025. After a rain delay, concrete foundations for the Heavy Equipment Port and Chemical Facility were poured in March 2025. The structural steel for the Heavy Equipment Port was received in April 2025, and the building is currently under construction. The building panels were delivered in August 2025. The contractor is coordinating with Southern California Edison for working in the vicinity of its power lines. The Air Quality Management District Permits to Construct and Operate the diesel backup generators were received in March 2025. The generator concrete pads were poured in May 2025. The generators were set on the pads in June 2025. The chemical tanks were delivered in August 2025 and anchored to the chemical pads. The electrical subcontractor is running the electrical conduits. The electrical subcontractor is planning to pour the concrete pads for the main electrical switchgear and generator switchgear in February 2026. The main switchboard, pumps and motors are expected to be delivered in March 2026.

### Capital Improvement Program Update

**File No.:** M24-104

**Description:** Develop a prioritized 10-year Capital Improvement Program (CIP) for water system improvements, including an updated supply and demand analysis, calibration of the hydraulic model, District-wide asset condition assessment, and development of a roadmap for Asset Management Program implementation.

**Status:** A contract was awarded to Carollo Engineers (Carollo) in May 2024. Technical Memo (TM) 1 Demands and TM 2 Supply were received in October 2024 and were reviewed by staff ahead of the Workshop on October 21, 2024. Revised TM 1 and TM 2 were received in January 2025. Staff provided pressure logger data and production data for the Hydraulic Model calibration in August 2024. Carollo's team performed asset condition assessment field work in August and September 2024. The Hydraulic Model TM was received in December 2024, and the workshop to review the TM was held on December 17, 2024. Staff provided additional data to the Carollo team to improve the hydraulic model calibration. A workshop to define the Asset Management Software Requirements was held in October 2024. Asset Management Software

demonstrations were held in November and December 2024. TM 5 Regulatory Requirements was received in October 2024 and was reviewed by staff. A workshop to define the asset Consequence of Failure was held in January 2025. TM 3 Transmission Systems Evaluation was received in January 2025 and was reviewed by staff. TM 9 Condition Assessment was received in January 2025 and reviewed by staff. Draft TM 10 CIP was received in March 2025 and was reviewed by staff. The draft TM 7 Asset Management Roadmap was received in April 2025 and was reviewed by staff. A workshop to review TM7 Asset Management Roadmap was held in April 2025. The results were presented to the Board in January 2026. Staff plans to bring the CIP for adoption to a future Board meeting.

### Local groundwater Supply Improvement Project (Local SIP)

**File No.:** M24-105

**Description:** The Local SIP will develop a feasibility study that meets the requirements of the Bureau of Reclamation's (USBR) Feasibility Study Directives and Standards (WTR 11-01) for a brackish groundwater desalination facility. The project is being conducted in partnership and cost sharing with Orange County Water District, City of Huntington Beach and City of Newport Beach.

**Status:** A contract was awarded to Black & Veatch Corporation (Black & Veatch) in May 2024. The project team has completed the evaluation of aquifer zones and selected the Talbert Gap on which to focus the alternative analysis for the feasibility study. The project team has also completed modeling the potential wellfield locations, developing treatment plant footprints, the Class V level life-cycle cost for the project, and developing the preferred alternative. The Board approved a contract amendment to the Black & Veatch contract for Clean Energy Capital to perform a funding analysis. The draft Feasibility Study was received and a review workshop was held in August 2025. Preliminary comments were received from USBR in September 2025. The final Feasibility Study was submitted to USBR in September 2025. Staff received comments on the final Feasibility Study from USBR in January 2026 and is currently working to resolve comments. In February 2026, staff received a proposal for next steps, including additional groundwater modeling refinement and subsidence evaluation. In February 2026, staff also met with USBR to discuss the Feasibility Study and next steps for the project and funding opportunities.

**Interagency Water Transfers (Newport Beach)**

**File No.:** M25-108

**Description:** Conduct a feasibility study to determine if Mesa Water can reliably serve groundwater to the City of Newport Beach.

**Status:** A contract was awarded to MKN & Associates (MKN). The draft feasibility study was received in July 2025 and a workshop to review was held in August 2025. MKN presented the results at the September 10, 2025 Board meeting. Staff is coordinating with MKN and the City of Newport Beach to design the connection. MKN submitted the 60% drawings in February 2026, which staff has provided comments on. The City of Costa Mesa issued an encroachment permit, and potholing activities are on track for February 2026.

**Interagency Water Transfers (Huntington Beach)**

**File No.:** M25-101

**Description:** Conduct a feasibility study to determine if Mesa Water can reliably serve groundwater to the City of Huntington Beach.

**Status:** A Cooperative Agreement was executed with the City of Huntington Beach in October 2024. Staff received three proposals from qualified consultants in June 2025. The Board awarded a contract to MKN & Associates (MKN) in July 2025. Notice to Proceed was provided in August 2025. A kickoff meeting was held in September 2025, and supply and demand data was collected in October 2025 and as of November 2025, MKN delivered a draft Feasibility Study in December 2025, which has been reviewed by staff from Mesa Water and the City of Huntington Beach. Comments have been provided to the consultant, and MKN is incorporating revisions, including refinement of regulatory considerations and infrastructure assumptions. The project has been introduced to the Department of Drinking Water, and coordination with DDW is ongoing. In February 2026, staff received and provided comments on the Draft Final Feasibility Study and continued discussions with DDW.

**Pipeline Integrity Program**

**File No.:** M25-103

**Description:** Implement Resolution No. 1525 Replacement of Assets.

**Status:** Since its inception in 2015, the Pipeline Integrity Program has been implemented by staff to use pipeline condition, rather than pipeline age, to prioritize pipeline replacements. The current and previous fiscal year's progress is described in this report. In Fiscal Year (FY) 2024, the Pipeline Integrity Program Consultant reviewed mainline break data from FY 2022 and FY 2023 and recommended condition assessment for pipeline groups with break thresholds that exceed the standards of Resolution No. 1525. These recommendations were presented to the Board in September 2023. Based on the recommendations, staff negotiated a proposal for ePulse condition assessment of 2.2 miles of AC pipe. The field work was completed in May 2024 and the report was received in July 2024. The results of the condition assessment were reviewed by the Pipeline Integrity Program Consultant. The consultant's report was received in October 2024 and reviewed by staff. No AC pipelines were recommended in the report. Additionally, Municipal Water District of Orange County (MWDOC) staff performed 100 miles of Leak Detection in May and June 2024. The final leak detection report was received in June 2024 and no mainline leaks were reported. Staff evaluated the feasibility of a condition assessment technology for small diameter metal pipelines, and has requested a proposal from a vendor. The contract for small diameter pipeline condition assessment was approved at the March 12, 2025 Board meeting. The condition assessment was attempted on June 16-17, 2025 but was not successful. Staff sent ten AC pipe samples collected in conjunction with routine work for wall thickness measurement in February 2025. The wall thickness measurements were received in April 2025 and were reviewed by staff and the Pipeline Integrity Program Consultant. No immediate pipeline replacements were suggested by the data. The Consultant's report was received in June 2025 and was reviewed by staff. MWDOC completed 100 miles of Leak Detection in May 2025. No mainline leaks were found. Permanent pressure transient monitoring at the pump stations and other strategic locations was installed in June 2025. Staff is evaluating several AI models to predict mainline breaks and prioritize pipeline replacement. A contract was awarded to HDR to continue as the Pipeline Integrity Program consultant for FY 2026. A kickoff meeting for FY 2026 work was held in September 2025. An update to the Board was presented in October 2025. An updated Replacement of Assets resolution was brought to the January 28, 2026 Board meeting and the Board's comments were incorporated. The revised Replacement of Assets resolution was brought to the February 11, 2026 Board meeting.

### SCADA Needs Assessment

**File No.:** M26-100

**Description:** Assess Mesa Water’s current Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition system, compile a comprehensive asset list, and define a path forward for modernization and future system improvements.

**Status:** Staff developed a draft Scope of Work and incorporated feedback from expert consultants. The Request for Proposal was posted in October 2025 and six proposals were received in November 2025. An information item was provided at the December 2025 Board meeting. A contract was awarded to West Yost at the January 14, 2026 Board meeting. The contract is expected to be executed in February 2026 and the kickoff is planned for March 2026.

**Mesa Water Education Center Flagpole**

**File No.:** M25-104

**Description:** Evaluate the most appropriate location and height of the flagpole at the Mesa Water Reliability Facility and then execute the construction of the selected flagpole.

**Status:** Staff received a draft report regarding the installation of a flagpole at the Mesa Water Education Center in December 2024. Staff reviewed the draft report and presented recommendations at the April 23, 2025 Board meeting. A design proposal was received in November 2025.

**Mesa Water Reliability Facility Electric Vehicle Charging Station**

**File No.:** M25-105

**Description:** Conduct a feasibility study and preliminary cost estimate of constructing electric vehicle (EV) charging stations at the Mesa Water Reliability Facility (MWRF).

**Status:** Staff is currently working with consulting companies and vendors to develop a feasibility report. Mesa Energy Systems submitted a proposal in January 2026, which staff is reviewing.

Based on these findings, it is highly unlikely that the worm originated from the water supply. No other customers on the property have reported observing worms in their water. The customer was advised to contact staff again if the issue reoccurs.







At its June 11, 2025 meeting, the Board of Directors (Board) approved the Fiscal Year (FY) 2026 Budget.


## DISCUSSION

Through the second quarter of FY 2026, Cash on Hand totaled \$20,982,270. Cash on Hand of \$20,982,270 is above the forecasted year-end cash balance of \$12,700,712.





Additionally, 201 Days Cash is above the forecasted Days Cash estimate of 113 days at year end by 88 days.



The Current Debt Coverage ratio is 348%, which exceeds both requirements for the 2017 & 2020 Revenue Certificates of Participation (COPs) and the Designated Funds Policy. The Debt Coverage ratio goal of the Board is 150% and was established in the Designated Funds Policy.

Water production is below budget through the second quarter by approximately -5.1%.

The mix of water production between clear and amber water has varied which is depicted in the table below:

Clear and amber water costs have a combined favorable variance of \$236,526 due to the production of water being lower than budgeted.

Total operating revenues year-to-date have an unfavorable balance of \$3,536 or approximately -0.1%. This is a result of monthly recycled water consumption being lower than expected. Additionally, operating expenses through the second quarter have a favorable balance of \$2,000,770 or approximately 9.4%. This is predominantly a result of lower than budgeted General and Administrative expenses and Transmission and Distribution expenses. As a result, operating income through December 31, 2025 has a favorable balance of \$2,120,542 or approximately 38%.

In addition, non-operating revenue, net of expenses, through the second quarter of FY 2026 has a favorable balance of \$1,532,809 or approximately 161.9%. This is mostly due to investment earnings.

Overall, the Change in Net Position has a favorable balance of \$3,098,221 or approximately 60.1% through December 31, 2025.

### PRIOR BOARD ACTION/DISCUSSION

At its November 21, 2013 meeting, the Legislative & Public Affairs Committee determined to seek lobbyist services to advocate for Mesa Water District's (Mesa Water®) policy platforms and positions. Following a competitive selection process, Mesa Water retained California Advocates (CA Advocates) initially to focus on a single policy issue from February through December 2014.

At its August 14, 2014 meeting, the Board of Directors (Board) approved increasing CA Advocates' activities for the District to include an additional policy issue from September through December 2014.

Subsequently, Mesa Water annually renewed CA Advocates' consulting services contract with the District for calendar years 2015 through 2020. In summer/fall of 2020, Mesa Water conducted a Request for Proposal (RFP) process for State Advocacy Consulting Services and, at its December 10, 2020 meeting, the Board approved a five-year contract with CA Advocates (through December 31, 2025).

### DISCUSSION

Since engaging with Mesa Water, CA Advocates has lobbied state administrative, legislative and regulatory audiences on issues relevant to the District. Advocacy for Mesa Water's [policy platforms and positions](#) requires significant work in Sacramento on multiple issues.



CA Advocates has proven to be effective for Mesa Water on several fronts, through active issues monitoring and engagement with: the Governor's administration; the California legislature and its leadership, committees, consultants, and staff; the Department of Water Resources and the State Water Resources Control Board; and staff, lawyers and lobbyists for the Association of California Water Agencies (ACWA), CalDesal, California Municipal Utilities Association (CMUA), California Special Districts Association (CSDA), WaterReuse CA (WRCA) and more.

Mesa Water's professional services procurement policy allows for contracts of up to seven consecutive years with a consulting firm, after which time, an RFP process is needed. Staff recommends amending Mesa Water's contract with CA Advocates for State Advocacy Consulting Services for a total amount not to exceed \$200,000 (\$100,000 annually) for Calendar Years 2026 and 2027.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

In Fiscal Year 2026, \$450,000 is budgeted for Water Policy Support Services; \$226,120 has been spent to date.

Approve a contract with John Robinson Consulting for three years for an amount not to exceed \$24,500 per year to provide Cross-Connection Testing Services.

### STRATEGIC PLAN

### PRIOR BOARD ACTION/DISCUSSION

### BACKGROUND

Mesa Water District (Mesa Water®) currently utilizes John Robinson Consulting (JRC) for Plan Check Services under a separate professional services agreement. The proposed contract represents an additional agreement with JRC to provide cross-connection coordination and testing and recycled water compliance. This item is being presented to the Board of Directors (Board) because the combined total of professional services agreements with JRC exceeds the District's \$75,000 professional services threshold, requiring Board approval.

### DISCUSSION

JRC will provide specialized support to Mesa Water's cross-connection control program, including coordination with outside regulatory agencies, site information gathering and cross-connection testing.

The District's cross-connection control program requires specialized technical expertise in testing, regulatory procedures and compliance documentation. Contracting with JRC ensures continued regulatory compliance, protects public health, reduces the risk of deficiencies and strengthens coordination with outside agencies. This contract provides a cost-effective solution that maintains Mesa Water's cross-connection control program integrity. Staff recommends the Board approve a contract with JRC for three years for an amount not to exceed \$24,500 per year to provide Cross-Connection Testing Services.

### FINANCIAL IMPACT

In Fiscal Year 2026, \$24,500 is budgeted for Cross-Connection Testing Services.

### RECOMMENDATION

Approve a contract with T2 Tech for \$55,306.89 to provide replacement of the wireless access points located at Mesa Water District Headquarters, and authorize execution of the contract.

### STRATEGIC PLAN

### PRIOR BOARD ACTION/DISCUSSION

None.

### BACKGROUND

This initiative addresses the impending end-of-life status of the existing wireless access points, which are over five years old and will soon lose vendor support. By replacing them with new hardware, the project will enhance wireless performance, ensuring reliable and faster connectivity for indoor and outdoor operations. T2 Tech will handle all phases from design to integration.

### DISCUSSION

#### **Project Overview**

Mesa Water District (Mesa Water®) has engaged T2 Tech to replace outdated wireless access points at District Headquarters, located on Placentia Avenue. The current equipment is approaching end-of-life, risking unsupported vulnerabilities and reduced performance. The new wireless access points will deliver improved wireless services, supporting Mesa Water's ongoing needs for robust network infrastructure. This project focuses solely on hardware replacement and related services, without requiring additional cabling or power upgrades.

#### **Scope of Work**

T2 Tech will deliver comprehensive services across five key phases:

1. **Design:** Develop an Integration Architecture Diagram and conduct team design reviews of artifacts. Deliverables include finalized designs and participation in related meetings.
2. **Staging:** Perform inventory management and create lists with locations and labels. Deliverables ensure all hardware is inventoried and properly labeled for deployment.

3. **Configuration:** Establish a baseline configuration, add wireless access points to the Meraki Portal and conduct pre-testing and validation. Deliverables confirm that configurations are applied and devices are portal-integrated prior to installation.
4. **Integration:** Physically replace the existing wireless access points and perform post-testing and validation. Deliverables include verifying successful replacement, testing and operational validation.
5. **Notifications and Meetings:** Prepare Change Control Review Board (CCRB) documentation and staff notifications, including implementation dates, and facilitate necessary meetings. Deliverables include distributed notifications and completed sessions.

These phases ensure a seamless transition with minimal disruption to District operations.

### Estimated Project Timeline

The project is structured in sequential phases, with the overall timeline projected as follows:

- **Design Phase:** 2–4 weeks (includes diagram creation, reviews and meetings; can run concurrently with procurement if needed).
- **Staging and Configuration Phases:** 2–3 weeks (inventory, labeling, baseline configuration, portal addition, pre-testing; performed off-site or in staging area prior to deployment).
- **Integration (Replacement and Post-Testing) Phase:** 1–2 weeks (physical replacement, testing and validation; scheduled during low-impact periods to minimize disruption, potentially in phased rollouts across indoor/outdoor areas).
- **Notifications, Meetings and Closeout:** Ongoing throughout, with final wrap-up in 1 week post-integration.

**Total Estimated Project Duration:** 8–12 weeks from project kickoff to full completion and handover.

### Rationale and Benefits

The refresh is critical to mitigate risks associated with unsupported hardware, including potential security threats and service interruptions. Benefits include:

- Enhanced wireless speed and reliability for improved productivity;
- Compliance with vendor support standards; and
- Future-proofing the network infrastructure at District Headquarters.



### **Recommendation**

Staff recommends the Board approve the replacement of wireless access points to ensure the continued reliability and performance of Mesa Water's wireless infrastructure. Upon approval, T2 Tech can initiate the design phase immediately, targeting completion within the estimated 8–12 week window to align with operational needs. This investment supports Mesa Water's commitment to technological excellence, operational resilience and proactive risk management.

### **FINANCIAL IMPACT**

Requested funding will come from Cash on Hand.

- a. Amend the On-Call Pipeline Construction Services contracts for Fiscal Year 2026 for an additional \$250,000 for a total annual amount not to exceed \$400,000, and authorize execution of the change order;
- b. Amend the On-Call Concrete and Paving Services contracts for Fiscal Year 2026 for an additional \$500,000 for a total annual amount not to exceed \$700,000, and authorize execution of the change order; and
- c. Amend the On-Call Electrical Services contracts for Fiscal Year 2026 for an additional \$120,000 for a total annual amount not to exceed \$210,000, and authorize execution of the change order.

### STRATEGIC PLAN

Goal #2: Perpetually renew and improve our infrastructure.

Goal #3: Be financially responsible and transparent.

### PRIOR BOARD ACTION/DISCUSSION

At its July 26, 2022 meeting, the Board of Directors (Board) approved execution of contracts to Ben's Asphalt, Inc. and T.E. Roberts, Inc. for a period of three years with two one-year renewal options for an annual amount not to exceed \$200,000 across all contracts to provide on-call concrete and paving services.

At its June 26, 2024 meeting, the Board approved execution of contracts to GCI Construction, Inc., J.A. Salazar Construction and Supply, Paulus Engineering and W. A. Rasic Construction Company, Inc. for a period of five years with two one-year renewal options for an annual amount not to exceed \$150,000 across all contracts to provide on-call pipeline and construction services.

At its June 26, 2024 meeting, the Board approved execution of contracts to Academy Electric, Inc., A.C. Pozos Electric Corporation, Baker Electric & Renewables LLC and Inter-Pacific, Inc. for a period of five years with two one-year renewal options for an annual amount not to exceed \$90,000 across all contracts to provide on-call electrical services.

At its February 11, 2026 meeting, the Board received an Information Item regarding on-call pipeline, paving and electrical construction services.



## DISCUSSION

The use of on-call construction contractors allows Mesa Water District (Mesa Water®) to react quickly to urgent operational events, such as pipeline breaks, pavement repairs and electrical issues that require external personnel and equipment beyond Mesa Water crews' expertise (i.e., deep excavations, shoring, wiring, etc.). The on-call contractors are also an efficient resource to complete small projects that take away from traditional capital replacement work efforts performed by Mesa Water crews. On-call contracts are awarded through competitive Request for Qualifications and Requests for Bids to licensed contractors registered with the State of California as Public Works contractors who demonstrate qualifications to complete typical Mesa Water on-call projects at Prevailing Wage rates.

Emergency work is assigned to contractors most readily available and capable of performing the work. Capital replacement work is competitively bid on a project-by-project basis to the pre-approved contractors to ensure cost effective pricing.

In October 2025, Mesa Water experienced multiple pipeline breaks and contractor-caused damage in the Reservoir 2 Pump Station. Paulus Engineering supported several of the pipeline break repairs, with Ben's Asphalt providing pavement repairs. Baker Electric has been instrumental in testing and replacing the electrical equipment damaged at the Reservoir 2 Pump Station.

In Fiscal Year (FY) 2026, \$150,000 is budgeted for On-Call Pipeline and Construction Services; \$149,338 has been spent to date. To pay the remainder of the outstanding invoices totaling \$191,344, and have contract authorization for emergency pipeline repairs for the remainder of the fiscal year, staff recommends the FY 2026 On-Call Pipeline and Construction Services budget be increased by \$250,000 for a total not to exceed \$400,000 for FY 2026.

In FY 2026, \$200,000 is budgeted for On-Call Concrete and Paving Services; \$80,843 has been spent to date. To pay the remainder of the outstanding invoices totaling \$465,504 and have contract authorization for emergency concrete and asphalt repairs for the remainder of the fiscal year, staff recommends the FY 2026 On-Call Concrete and Paving Services budget be increased by \$500,000 for a total not to exceed \$700,000 for FY 2026.

In Fiscal Year 2026, \$90,000 is budgeted for On-Call Electrical Services; \$44,158 has been spent to date. Baker Electric is supporting the Reservoir 2 Pump Station Recovery and Academy Electric is providing electrical services for several efforts, including the back up power at Well Nos. 12 and 14. Each electrical contractor has billed approximately \$22,000. Staff recommends the FY 2026 budget for On-Call Electrical Services be increased by \$120,000 for a total not to exceed \$210,000 for FY 2026.



## FINANCIAL IMPACT

In Fiscal Year 2026:

- \$150,000 is budgeted for On-Call Pipeline and Construction Services; \$149,338 has been spent to date.
- \$200,000 is budgeted for On-Call Concrete and Paving Services; \$80,843 has been spent to date.
- \$90,000 is budgeted for On-Call Electrical Services; \$44,158 has been spent to date.

### PRIOR BOARD ACTION/DISCUSSION

At its July 26, 2023 meeting, the Board of Directors (Board) awarded a one-year contract to Brown and Caldwell for an amount not to exceed \$100,000 to provide Grant Writing and Grant Administration Support Services.

At its June 26, 2024 meeting, the Board approved a one-year contract to West Yost for an amount not to exceed \$80,000 to provide Grant Writing and Grant Administration Support Services.

At its June 25, 2025 meeting, the Board approved a contract amendment to West Yost for an amount not to exceed \$80,000 per year for five years, for a total contract amendment amount not to exceed \$400,000, to provide Grant Writing and Administration Support Services, and authorize execution of the contract amendment.

At its November 12, 2025 meeting, the Board authorized the General Manager to accept Hazard Mitigation Grant Program funds, if awarded, for the Mesa Water Reliability Facility Emergency Backup Power Project and commit a Mesa Water District cost share for an amount not to exceed \$960,500 (25% of total project cost).

At its February 11, 2026 meeting, the Board received an Information Item regarding Grant Writing and Administration Support Services.

### DISCUSSION

Mesa Water District (Mesa Water®) continues to actively pursue state and federal grant funding to offset capital improvement costs for priority infrastructure projects. Grant writing and administration support services are used to identify funding opportunities, prepare competitive



applications, and manage post-award compliance and reporting requirements.

During Fiscal Year (FY) 2026, the level of effort associated with grant support activities exceeded what is typically supported under the annual on-call budget. In particular, staff worked with the District's on-call grant consultant to prepare and submit a Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) application for the Mesa Water Reliability Facility Emergency Backup Power Project. Development of this application required extensive technical coordination, cost development, benefit-cost analysis and responses to state and federal review requirements. In addition, staff continued advancing ongoing Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) application materials.

As a result of these efforts, the FY 2026 budget for Grant Writing and Administration Support Services has been fully expended. Staff is requesting approval of a contract amendment in the amount of \$55,000 to allow completion of the remaining FY 2026 grant-related work.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

For Fiscal Year 2026, \$80,000 is budgeted for Grant Writing and Administration Support Services; \$79,984 has been spent to date. Requested funding will come from Cash on Hand.







### RECOMMENDATION

This item is provided for information.

### STRATEGIC PLAN

Goal #1: Provide an abundant, local, reliable and safe water supply.  
Goal #2: Perpetually renew and improve our infrastructure.

### PRIOR BOARD ACTION/DISCUSSION

At its November 8, 2023 meeting, the Board awarded a contract to Pacific Hydrotech Corporation (Pacific Hydrotech) for \$14,764,900 and a 10% contingency of \$1,476,490 for a total amount not to exceed \$16,241,390 for the construction of the Reservoirs 1 and 2 Pump Station Upgrades Project, directed staff to negotiate a contract end date, and authorized execution of the contract.

At its July 10, 2024 meeting, the Board awarded a contract to Lee + Ro, Inc. for \$271,500 and a 10% contingency of \$27,150 for a total amount not to exceed \$298,650 to provide Engineering Services During Construction for the Reservoirs 1 and 2 Pump Station Upgrades Project, and authorized execution of the contract.

At its June 25, 2025 meeting, the Board awarded a contract to Black & Veatch Corporation for an amount not to exceed \$552,359 to provide Construction Management and Inspection Services for the Reservoirs 1 and 2 Pump Station Upgrades Project, and authorized execution of the contract.

### BACKGROUND

Mesa Water District (Mesa Water®) delivers abundant, local, reliable and safe potable water to its ratepayers using nine groundwater wells and two storage reservoirs, each with a pump station. Constant pressure in the distribution system is supplied by the groundwater well pumps, with the reservoirs and associated pump stations serving to balance flow and pressure with demand. The reservoirs also provide a total of 28 million gallons of storage that can be used during peak demands, maintenance events or firefighting. However, water quality issues have limited the amount of water that can be reliably stored. Additionally, the current reservoir pump stations utilize natural gas engines to drive the main pumps and electric motors for the smaller jockey pumps that manage low flow requirements. These gas engines are near the end of their useful life and require replacement. In 2020, a Water Supply, Energy and Supply Chain Reliability Assessment was completed which recommended replacing the gas engines with electric motors and diesel generator back-up power. The recommendation was based on the standardization of pump drive and backup technologies with the clear wells.



The purpose of the Reservoirs 1 and 2 Pump Station Upgrades Project is to improve overall system reliability and streamline operations and maintenance. The following components were included in the scope of work for the project:

- Replacement of natural gas engine driven pumps with electric motor driven pumps at Reservoir 1
- Replacement of propane backup systems with standby diesel generators at Reservoir 1
- Demolition of hydro turbines at Reservoir 1
- Comprehensive rehabilitation of pumping systems piping, valves and instrumentation at Reservoir 1
- Replacement of electrical gear to support new electrical systems at Reservoir 1
- Upgrade of Southern California Edison (SCE) services for both reservoir sites
- Upgrade of selected structures and maintenance facilities
- Replacement of existing slurry dewatering pit at Reservoir 1
- Addition of two new electric motor driven jockey pumps at Reservoir 2
- Incorporation of new chemical facilities at both reservoirs

## DISCUSSION

In November 2023, the Board awarded a contract for the construction of the Reservoirs 1 and 2 Pump Station Upgrades Project. The project was making good progress at both the Reservoir 1 and Reservoir 2 sites until October 2025, when the motive water line to supply the Reservoir 2 mixers failed and flooded the Reservoir 2 Pump Station. The existing pump station equipment, including the natural gas powered engines, right angle gear drives, electrical equipment and instrumentation were all damaged. Reservoir 2 and the Pump Station have been offline since the incident as equipment is being tested, repaired and replaced. The current recovery schedule has the pump station in service in June 2026. The new construction was also damaged, including the variable frequency drives (VFDs) and the chemical management system pumps. Work has continued on the Reservoir 1 upgrades. However, until Reservoir 2 and its pump station are reliably back in service, Reservoir 1 and the Reservoir 1 Pump Station must remain in service and the Reservoir 1 Pump Station upgrades will be paused.

The Reservoir 2 Pump Station has four natural gas fired engines and four right angle gear drives to transfer the rotational energy from the horizontal engine shafts to the vertical turbine pumps. Mesa Water's Engine Maintenance Contractor, Emissions Compliance Controls Company (ECCC), evaluated the four engines and right angle gear drives. All four right angle gear drives sustained water damage and are being replaced. All four engines sustained water damage. Engine 2 was operating at the time of the incident and took on water. ECCC has provided a cost estimate of \$150,000 for a complete engine overhaul. A request for a change order to ECCC's Maintenance Contract will be brought to a future Board meeting for approval. Engines 1, 3 and 4 each sustained some damage. ECCC is repairing and replacing damaged parts for Engines 1, 3 and 4 under the existing engine maintenance contract.

The Construction Management and Inspection consultant, Black and Veatch (BV), has provided excellent support to the Reservoir 2 Pump Station recovery. BV has assigned senior staff with experience in project disaster recovery to support its construction inspection team and Mesa



Water. The additional senior staff, as well as the longer project schedule has impacted the budget for construction management and inspection. Staff will bring a request for a contract amendment to BV's contract to continue to support the Reservoir 2 Pump Station Recovery, and see the project through to completion. The recovery support effort is estimated for nine months from the incident at \$274,548. The project delay will add 20 months to the original 16-month project schedule anticipated when the Construction Management and Inspection Task Order was awarded to BV in FY 2022. The cost for the additional effort is estimated at \$710,252. An amendment of \$948,800 will be requested at a future Board meeting. The construction contract allows Mesa Water to assess liquidated damages of \$1,500 per day to the contractor for each day of delay past the approved construction schedule.

Reservoir 2 and Pump Station are critical infrastructure for Mesa Water. Staff is working to return Reservoir 2 and Pump Station to operation as soon as possible. In many cases, Mesa Water must contract for the repairs. Staff has been using on-call contract authorizations to fund repairs where applicable. Some repairs require new contracts that require authorization from the Board. In a future Board meeting, staff will bring a recommendation to authorize the General Manager to approve contacts and change orders to contracts up to \$500,000 in aggregate.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

In Fiscal Year 2026, \$552,359 was approved for BV to provide Construction Management and Inspection for the Reservoir 1 and 2 Upgrades Project through March 2026; \$232,965 has been spent to date.

In Fiscal Year 2026, \$138,000 was approved via two contracts with ECCC to provide gas engine and right angle gear drive maintenance; \$35,437 has been spent to date.

\$19,500,000 is budgeted for the Reservoirs 1 and 2 Pump Station Upgrades Project; \$11,430,000 has been spent to date.

### **Federal Government Update**

After Congress failed to pass all 12 FY2026 appropriations bills by the CR deadline of January 30<sup>th</sup>, portions of the federal government entered a partial shutdown.

On January 30<sup>th</sup> the Senate passed five funding bills by a vote of 71-29: Defense; Financial Services and General Government; Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education; National Security and Department of State; and Transportation, Housing and Urban Development appropriations bills and an extension of Department of Homeland Security funding through February 13<sup>th</sup>. On February 3<sup>rd</sup>, the House voted 217 to 214 on the five spending bills to fund the federal government through September. The funding package was signed into law on February 3<sup>rd</sup>. Separately, the Energy and Water Development bill was signed into law on January 23<sup>rd</sup>.

As of February 17<sup>th</sup>, the Homeland Security bill remains unresolved as it did not pass before the February 13<sup>th</sup> deadline.

### **Greenhouse Gas Endangerment Finding Eliminated**

On February 12<sup>th</sup>, the EPA announced they will be eliminating the Obama-era 2009 Greenhouse Gas (GHG) Endangerment Finding and all subsequent federal GHG emission standards for all vehicles and engines of model years 2012 to 2027 and beyond. The agency expects this deregulation to make more affordable vehicles available for American families, decrease the cost of living on all products by lowering the cost of trucks, and save American taxpayers over \$1.3 trillion. The deregulation is supported by the agency's conclusion that in the 16 years since the Endangerment Finding was originated, many of the predictions and assumptions used to justify the rule did not materialize. Due to this conclusion, the agency stated "maintaining GHG emission standards is not necessary for EPA to fulfill its core mission of protecting human health and the environment."

### **Schiff Sends EPA Letter on the Updated WOTUS Definitions**

On November 20<sup>th</sup>, the EPA, along with the Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), released a [proposed rule](#) updating the definition of "Waters of the United States" (WOTUS) with the purpose of creating a clear, durable, and common-sense standard consistent with the *Sackett v. EPA* Supreme Court decision. The proposal aims to provide regulatory certainty, reduce burdens, and support economic growth for farmers, landowners, energy producers, developers, and other industries. Key revisions include defining terms, like "relatively permanent," "continuous surface

connection,” and “tributary,” to align with the Clean Water Act and Supreme Court precedent. Jurisdictional tributaries must directly connect to traditional navigable waters or through features that provide predictable, consistent flow and wetlands must be indistinguishable from jurisdictional waters via a continuous surface connection and must hold surface water for a consistent duration each year.

On January 28<sup>th</sup>, sixteen Democrats sent a [letter](#) to the EPA to voice their concerns regarding the recently redefined definitions. Senator Adam Schiff (D-CA) led the letter, signed by every Democrat on the Environment and Public Works Committee except for Senator Mark Kelly (D-AZ). The letter highlighted concerns with the more limiting definitions, stating the proposed rule is “legally unnecessary, scientifically unsound, and will harm public and environmental health by allowing more harmful chemicals into our waterways.” The Senators urged the EPA to “immediately abandon” the rule and refocus “efforts on protecting the American people’s right to clean and safe water.”

### **Developments in Colorado River Negotiations**

In early February Interior Secretary Doug Burgum met with governors from the seven Colorado River basin States ahead of the February 14<sup>th</sup> federal deadline to find a solution. The meeting did not result in any major progress forward, though, and only renewed the commitments to continue negotiations. While a long-term (20-year) agreement seems unlikely, federal officials are now encouraging a short-term five-year deal as a bridge toward a longer-term solution. Federal funding for conservation and water projects was discussed as a potential incentive to help close gaps between States. Governors have stated they are moving toward a framework but do not expect to reach a final agreement by the federal deadline.

Arizona faces the greatest legal vulnerability because its canal system holds junior water rights, making it first in line for cuts and raising economic and political stakes. Arizona officials warned they may use an enforcement provision of the Colorado River Compact to force Upper Basin States to send more water downstream if no agreement is reached before the deadline. The “compact call” would mean Lower Basin States (Arizona, California, and Nevada) could require Upper Basin States (Colorado, New Mexico, Utah, and Wyoming) to pause some uses and release water from reservoirs like Flaming Gorge, Navajo, and Blue Mesa. This move could prompt litigation with the Supreme Court.

### **Sen. Padilla Introduces Water Supply and Drought Resilience Bills**

On February 4<sup>th</sup>, Senator Alex Padilla (D-CA) introduced a pair of bills with the goal of addressing water supply challenges in cities and agriculture communities in California. The [Making Our Communities Resilient through Enhancing Water for Agriculture, Technology, the Environment, and Residences \(MORE WATER\) Act](#) would reauthorize the Bureau of Reclamation (BOR) large-scale recycled water program, providing federal grants for up to 25% of the cost of these recycling projects, and would create a new federal grant program to help repair California’s water delivery system. The [Growing Resilient Operations from Water Savings and Municipal- Agricultural Reciprocally-beneficial Transactions \(GROW SMART\) Act](#), would authorize \$5 million per year for

seven years for the BOR to fund the development of voluntary agricultural partnerships with municipal, industrial, and commercial entities and the design of innovative water-saving projects.

### **EPA's Request to Pull Back PFAS Limits is Rejected**

On January 21<sup>st</sup>, a federal appeals court rejected the Trump administration's request to pull back drinking water limits for four types of PFAS while continuing to maintain the limits for PFOA and PFOS. Though the D.C. Circuit Court denied the administration's request, they did not rule on the final legality of the standards, allowing the case to move forward with briefs due in March 2026. In the meantime, the EPA's 2024 PFAS drinking water standards remain in effect, and water systems are expected to continue moving forward with monitoring and testing requirements.

The administration has indicated it intends to eliminate the rule's "hazard index" calculations for four PFAS compounds. This plan is supported by the two water utility trade groups that filed the original lawsuit in 2024, the American Water Works Association and the Association of Metropolitan Water Agencies. The hazard index applies to mixtures of PFNA, PFHxS, PFBS, and/or GenX in drinking water and represents the first time the EPA has used a cumulative risk framework of this kind in a national drinking water regulation.

### **Water Conservation Rebate Tax Parity Act ([H.R.1871](#), [S.857](#)) Rep. Jared Huffman (D-CA), Sen. John Curtis (R-UT)**

**Status:** House - 03/05/2025 Referred to the House Committee on Ways and Means.

Senate - 03/05/2025 Referred to the Committee on Finance.

**Summary:** This legislation will amend federal tax law to ensure homeowners do not have to pay income tax when they receive rebates from water utilities for water conservation and water runoff management improvements.

### **Special District Fairness & Accessibility Act ([H.R.2766](#), [S.2014](#)) Rep. Pat Fallon (R-TX), Sen. John Cornyn (R-TX)**

**Status:** House - 04/09/2025 Referred to the House Committee on Oversight and Government Reform.

Senate - 06/10/2025 Read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs

**Summary:** This bill will require special districts to be recognized as local government and be eligible for federal funding.

### **Low-Income Household Assistance Water Program (LIHWAP) Establishment Act ([H.R.4733](#)) Rep. Eric Sorensen (D-IL)**

**Status:** House - 12/01/2025 Referred to the Subcommittee on Water Resources and Environment

**Summary:** This bill will direct the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to make permanent the Low-Income Household Assistance Water Program (LIHWAP). This bill will allow HHS to award grants to eligible entities to provide funds to public water systems to assist low-income households in paying for drinking water or wastewater services.

### **Water Infrastructure Modernization Act (WIMA) ([S.2388](#), [H.R.6075](#)) Sen. Ruben Gallego (D-AZ), Rep. Robert Bresnahan (R-PA)**

**Status:** Senate - 07/23/2025 Referred to the Committee on Environment and Public Works.

House - 11/19/2025 Referred to the Subcommittee on Water Resources and Environment.

**Summary:** This bill will provide \$50 million in grant funding for community water systems to purchase and implement new water technologies, including those that can identify water loss, examine pipe integrity, detect leaks, prepare for severe weather, innovate water storage systems, and more.

### **Water Cybersecurity Enhancement Act of 2025 ([S.1549](#), [H.R.5868](#)) Sen. Ruben Gallego (D-AZ)**

**Status:** Senate - 05/01/2025 Referred to the Committee on Environment and Public Works.

House - 10/28/2025 Referred to the House Committee on Energy and Commerce.

**Summary:** This bill will extend and expand the Drinking Water Infrastructure Risk and Resilience Program and provide technical assistance and grants to community water systems for training and guidance regarding protecting from and responding to cyberattacks.

## **WATCH**

### **Regulations from the Executive in Need of Scrutiny (REINS) Act ([H.R. 142](#)) Rep. Kat Cammack (R-FL)**

**Status:** House - 01/03/2025 Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committees on Rules, and the Budget

**Summary:** This bill will aim to increase accountability and transparency in the federal regulatory process by requiring that any new "major rule" proposed by federal agencies receive approval from both the House and Senate before taking effect.

### **To eliminate federal funding for the failed California High-Speed Rail project ([H.R. 213](#)) Rep. Kevin Kiley (R-CA)**

**Status:** House - 01/07/2025 Referred to the House Subcommittee on Railroads, Pipelines, and Hazardous Materials.

**Summary:** This bill will prohibit the use of Federal financial assistance for the California High-Speed Rail development project in the State of California.

### **Colorado River Basin System Conservation Extension Act ([H.R. 231](#), [S.154](#)) Rep. Harriet Hageman (R-WY), Sen. John Hickenlooper (D-CO)**

**Status:** House - 02/12/2025 Ordered to be Reported (Amended) by Unanimous Consent.  
Senate - 06/18/2025 Passed Senate without amendment by Voice Vote.

**Summary:** This bill will reauthorize the Colorado River System Conservation Pilot Program through fiscal year 2026.

### **Preserving Choice in Vehicle Purchase Act ([H.R.346](#)) Rep. John Joyce (R-PA)**

**Status:** House - 01/13/2025 Referred to the House Committee on Energy and Commerce.

**Summary:** This bill will block the U.S. Environmental Agency from giving California a waiver to "limit the sale or use of new motor vehicles with internal combustion engines." It would do so by modifying the waiver process under the Clean Air Act related to state emission control standards for new motor vehicles.

### **Providing for congressional disapproval under chapter 8 of title 5, United States Code, of the rule submitted by the Environmental Protection Agency relating to "National Primary Drinking Water Regulations for Lead and Copper: Improvements (LCRI) ([H.J. Res. 18](#)) Rep. Gary Palmer (R-AL)**

**Status:** House - 01/13/2025 Referred to the House Committee on Energy and Commerce.

**Summary:** This joint resolution nullifies the rule titled National Primary Drinking Water Regulations for Lead and Copper: Improvements (LCRI), which was submitted by the Environmental Protection Agency on October 30, 2024.

### **Every Drop Counts Act ([H.R. 338](#)) Rep. Jim Costa (D-CA)**

**Status:** House - 11/19/2025 Subcommittee Hearings Held.

**Summary:** This bill will expand the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law's Small Storage Program by making it easier for groundwater projects to qualify for funding, increase the amount of water they can store, and stabilize underground aquifers.

**Fix Our Forests Act ([H.R.471](#), [S.1462](#)) Rep. Bruce Westerman (R-AR), Sen. John Curtis (R-UT)**

**Status:** House – 01/23/2025 Passed in house 279 - 141

Senate - 10/27/2025 Placed on Senate Legislative Calendar under General Orders.

**Summary:** This bill simplifies and expedites environmental reviews for forest management projects, promotes federal, state, tribal, and local collaboration, and deters frivolous litigation that delays essential projects.

**Stop the Delta Tunnel Act ([H.R.1311](#)) Rep. Josh Harder (D-CA)**

**Status:** House: 7/24/2025 Became law

**Summary:** This bill will increase funding for Forest Service and DOI for prescribed burns, establish a program for implementation of prescribed burns, establish a program for workforce development, and facilitate coordination between land managers and air quality agencies to alter prescribed burn practices to reduce catastrophic smoke events in the summer.

**PFAS National Drinking Water Standard Act of 2025 ([H.R.4168](#)) Rep. Brian Fitzpatrick (R-PA)**

**Status:** House - 06/26/2025 Referred to the House Committee on Energy and Commerce.

**Summary:** This bill will codify the EPA's final PFAS National Primary Drinking Water Regulation, establishing enforceable maximum contaminant levels (MCLs) for six of the most hazardous PFAS chemicals, including PFOA and PFOS, in public drinking water systems.

**WILTR Act of 2025 ([H.R.4181](#)) Rep. Darrell Issa (R-CA)**

**The Healthy Drinking Water Affordability Act (Healthy H2O Act) ([H.R.4721](#), [S.2436](#)) Rep. David Rouzer (R-NC), Sen. Tammy Baldwin (D-WI)**

**Status:** House - 07/23/2025 Referred to the House Committee on Agriculture.

Senate - 07/24/2025 Read twice and referred to the Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry.

**Summary:** This bill will provide grants through the U.S. Department of Agriculture for water quality testing and to purchase and install point-of-entry water filtration systems to remove contaminants from drinking water.

**Summary:** This bill will reauthorize the Bureau of Reclamation's Snow Water Supply Forecasting Program which provides grants to advance emerging snow monitoring technology that improve water supply predictions.

**Fixing Emergency Management for Americans (FEMA) Act ([H.R.4669](#)) Rep. Sam Graves (R-MO)**

**Status:** House - 09/03/2025 Ordered to be Reported (Amended) by the Yeas and Nays: 57 - 3

**Summary:** This bill will authorize and improve the Federal Emergency Management Agency and reform Federal disaster mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery.

**Water Infrastructure Resiliency Act ([H.R.5513](#)) Rep. Vince Fong (R-CA)**

**Status:** House - 09/20/2025 Referred to the Subcommittee on Water Resources and Environment.

**Summary:** This bill will clarify eligible uses under the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) to include modern software tools for the modernization of infrastructure.

**Golden Mussel Eradication and Control Act of 2025 ([H.R.3717](#)) Rep. Josh Harder (D-CA)**

**Status:** House - 06/04/2025 Referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure and the Committee on Natural Resources

**Summary:** Directs federal efforts to control and eradicate invasive golden mussel populations in U.S. waterways to protect ecosystems and infrastructure.

**Regional Leadership in Wildland Fire Research Act ([H.R.6154](#), [S.647](#)) Rep. Dave Min (D-CA), Sen. Ben Ray Lujan (D-NM)**

**Status:** House - 11/19/2025 Referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, and the Committees on Agriculture, and Science, Space, and Technology.

Senate - 02/20/2025 Referred to the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation.

**No Taxation on PFAS Remediation Act ([H.R. 6669](#)) Rep. Chris Pappas (D-NH)**

**Status:** House - 12/11/2025 Referred to the House Committee on Ways and Means.

**Summary:** This bill will amend the Internal Revenue Code to ensure that reimbursements or rebates used for PFAS cleanup are excluded from gross income for tax purposes.

**Clean Water Standards for PFAS Act ([H.R. 6668](#)) Rep. Chris Pappas (D-NH)**

**Status:** House - 02/02/2026 Referred to the Subcommittee on Water Resources and Environment.

**Summary:** This bill will require the EPA to establish effluent limitation guidelines and water quality criteria for PFAS discharges under the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, setting regulatory deadlines for industry controls.

**Community Protection and Wildfire Resilience Act ([S.3609](#), [H.R.582](#)) Sen. Alex Padilla (D-CA), Rep. Jared Huffman (D-CA)**

**Status:** Senate - 01/08/2026 Referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs.

House - 01/21/2025 Referred to the Committee on Science, Space, and Technology, and in addition to the Committees on Natural Resources, and Agriculture

**Summary:** This bill will create a new federal grant program to invest \$1 billion annually to help communities develop and implement Community Protection and Wildfire Resilience Plans

**Making Our Communities Resilient through Enhancing Water for Agriculture, Technology, the Environment, and Residences (MORE WATER) Act ([Not yet on Congress.gov](#)) Sen. Alex Padilla (D-CA)**

**Status:** Introduced 02/02/2026

**Summary:** This bill will reauthorize the Bureau of Reclamation (BOR) large-scale recycled water program, providing federal grants for up to 25% of the cost of these recycling projects, and would create a new federal grant program to help repair California's water delivery system.

**Growing Resilient Operations from Water Savings and Municipal- Agricultural Reciprocally-beneficial Transactions (GROW SMART) Act ([Not yet on Congress.gov](#)) Sen. Alex Padilla (D-CA)**

**Status:** Introduced 02/02/2026

**Summary:** This bill will authorize \$5 million per year for seven years for the BOR to fund the development of voluntary agricultural partnerships with municipal, industrial, and commercial entities and the design of innovative water-saving projects.

**Firefighting Infrastructure for Rural and Exurban Smaller Municipalities Augmenting Residential Fuels Treatments Act (FIRE SMART ACT) (Not yet on Congress.gov) Sen. Alex Padilla (D-CA)**

**Status:**

**Summary:** This bill will make projects that have both drinking water benefits and fire suppression benefits in rural communities eligible for Drinking Water State Revolving Funds (DWSRF) loans.

**Water Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act Amendments of 2025 ([H.R.6229](#)) Rep. Kim Schrier (D-WA)**

**Status:** House - 11/22/2025 Referred to the Subcommittee on Water Resources and Environment.

**Summary:**

**Wester Wildlife Support Act ([S.91](#), [H.R.5782](#)) Rep. Joe Neguse (D-CO),**

**Summary:** This bill will direct the Secretary of Agriculture to carry out wildfire suppression and to not suppress wildfire fighting efforts.

**Advanced Capabilities for Emergency Response Operations (ACERO) Act ([H.R.3930](#)) Rep. Vince Fong (R-CA)**

**Status:** House - 06/11/2025 Ordered to be Reported in the Nature of a Substitute by the Yeas and Nays: 34 - 0.

**Summary:** This bill will authorize the ACERO program which conducts research and development activities regarding aerial response to wildfires using uncrewed aircraft systems (UAS) and other advanced aviation technologies.

**Save Our Sequoias Act ([H.R.2709](#)) Rep. Vince Fong (R-CA)**

**Status:** House - 04/18/2025 Referred to the Subcommittee on Forestry and Horticulture.

**Summary:** This bill will establish a set of programs to improve the health and resiliency of giant sequoias, including shared stewardship agreements, emergency response, reforestation strategies, and collaborative restoration grants.

**Snow Water Supply Forecasting Reauthorization Act ([H.R.3857](#)) Rep. Jeff Hurd (R-CO)**

**Status:** Senate - 12/11/2025 Received in the Senate and Read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources.

**Summary:** This bill will reauthorize and modify the Bureau of Reclamation's Snow Water Supply Forecasting Program through FY2031.

**Water Infrastructure Resilience and Sustainability Act ([S.3590](#), [H.R.5566](#)) Sen. Lisa Blunt Rochester (D-DE), Rep. Salud Carbajal (D-CA)**

**Status:** Senate - 01/07/2026 Read twice and referred to the Committee on Environment and Public Works.

House - 12/01/2025 Referred to the Subcommittee on Water Resources and Environment.

**Summary:** This bill will amend the Federal Water Pollution Control Act to reauthorize the clean water infrastructure resiliency and sustainability program, and amend the Safe Drinking Water Act to reauthorize drinking water resilience and midsize/large system sustainability programs.

With the bill introduction deadline of February 20, quickly approaching, as of February 13, the California Legislature has introduced just under 700 bills. The Assembly has introduced approximately 450 Assembly Bills (ABs) and the Senate has introduced approximately 240 Senate Bills (SBs).

Of the roughly 700 bills introduced so far, approximately 170 of those are placeholder bills or “spot” bills. These spot bills make small non-substantive changes to the law and simply hold a spot for the actual substantive language that will be amended into the bill at a later date. With just four days remaining, it is expected that an additional 1,250 bills will be introduced this week.

Though the 2026 legislative year is still unclear, related to water and natural resources, several issues have begun to rise to the surface.

Infrastructure funding, both through Prop 4 and the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund (GGRF), will be a significant focal point of the water community. The State Water Contractors are advocating for \$150 million ongoing through the GGRF to address the impacts of subsidence on the State Water Project. In addition, as reported below, the water community, business groups, and environmental interests are all advocating that Prop 4 funding should be exempt from the regulatory process and that grant funds should move out quickly.

In addition, several proposals related to groundwater recharge are being discussed by water associations, the legislature, agriculture interests, and the Newsom Administration. However, with days left to introduce bills and policy committee hearings yet to take place in earnest, the Legislature has ample time to introduce new issues into the mix.

### **Key Bills**

**AB 35 (Alvarez) - Safe Drinking Water, Wildfire Prevention, Drought Preparedness, and Clean Air Bond Act of 2024: Administrative Procedure Act: exemption: program guidelines and selection criteria.**

This bill would exempt Proposition 4 funds from the regulatory process, typically used to create new programs. Instead, this bill would require a state entity that receives funding to administer a competitive grant program that includes a project solicitation and evaluation guidelines and to submit those guidelines to the Secretary of the Natural Resources Agency for approval. This bill contains an urgency clause which means that if signed by the Governor, it would take effect immediately. This bill would provide parity for Prop 4 funding with other previously passed bonds.

### **SB 885 (Strickland) – Major Regulations**

This bill would prohibit a state agency from taking final action to adopt a major regulation, defined as having an economic impact of greater than \$50 million, until the state agency submits a proposal to the Legislature recommending legislation to authorize the adoption of the major regulation and the Legislature enacts a law expressly authorizing the state agency to adopt that major regulation. The bill, would authorize a state agency to adopt an emergency regulation that is a major regulation if the state agency complies with specified requirements governing the adoption of emergency regulations.

## **Regulatory and Administrative Actions**

### **Delta Conveyance Project**

On December 4, the State Water Board announced a Ninth Amended Notice of Public Hearing and Procedural Ruling. The purpose of the hearing is to gather evidence that the State Water Board will consider to determine whether to approve change petitions filed by the Department of Water Resources (DWR) to add two new points of diversion and rediversion for the State Water Project.

### **Water Recycling Proposition 4 Funding**

On January 21, the State Water Board adopted Emergency Regulations to administer the \$150 million of Proposition 4 funds appropriated by the Budget Act of 2025 for water recycling funding.

### **Impacts of Sackett v. Environmental Protection Agency (2023) Report**

On January 5, the State Water Board published the Impacts of United States Supreme Court’s Decision in Sackett v. Environmental Protection Agency (2023) 598 U.S. 651 (Report). The Report addresses the Sackett ruling and its alteration of the regulatory landscape for water quality protection in California. The report identifies some additional enforcement that the State Water Board could take on to ensure protection of waters.

**Summary:** Under existing law, the State Water Resources Control Board and the 9 California regional water quality control boards regulate water quality and prescribe waste discharge requirements in accordance with the Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act (act) and the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit program. Under the act, the State Water Resources Control Board is authorized to adopt water quality control plans for waters for which quality standards are required by the federal Clean Water Act, as specified, and that in the event of a conflict, those plans supersede regional water quality control plans for the same waters. This bill would authorize the state board to adopt water quality control plans for nexus waters, which the bill would define as all waters of the state that are not also navigable, except as specified. The bill would require any water quality standard that was submitted to, and approved by, or is awaiting approval by, the United States Environmental Protection Agency or the state board that applied to nexus waters as of May 24, 2023, to remain in effect, as provided. The bill would require the state board and regional boards to include nexus waters in all federal Clean Water Act processes, including, but not limited to, the California Integrated Report and the establishment of total maximum daily loads, as specified. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

**Summary:** Existing law, the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act, requires all groundwater basins designated as high- or medium-priority basins by the Department of Water Resources to be managed under a groundwater sustainability plan or coordinated groundwater sustainability plans, except as specified. Existing law requires the department to periodically review the groundwater sustainability plans developed by groundwater sustainability agencies pursuant to the act to evaluate whether a plan conforms with specified laws and is likely to achieve the sustainability goal for the basin covered by the plan. Existing law requires a groundwater sustainability agency to evaluate its groundwater sustainability plan periodically. This bill would require a groundwater sustainability agency to, at least once every 7 years, review, and update if appropriate, its sustainable yield to ensure that the sustainable yield is based on the best available information and best available science, as defined, and will achieve sustainable groundwater management. The bill would also require a groundwater sustainability agency to provide an opportunity for public review and comment before making a determination whether to update its sustainable yield. To the extent that these requirements impose additional duties on groundwater sustainability agencies that are local agencies, the bill would impose a state-mandated local program. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

**SB 885** (**Strickland R**) **Major regulations.** (Introduced: 1/13/2026 [html](#) [pdf](#))

**Status:** 2/11/2026-Referred to Com. on G.O.

**Location:** 2/11/2026-S. G.O.

**Summary:** Existing law, known as the Administrative Procedure Act, governs the procedures for the adoption, amendment, or repeal of regulations by state agencies and for the review of those regulatory actions by the Office of Administrative Law. Existing law requires a state agency proposing to adopt, amend, or repeal an administrative regulation to, among other things, assess the potential for adverse economic impact on California business enterprises and individuals, and requires a state agency proposing to adopt, amend, or repeal a major regulation on or after November 1, 2013, to prepare and submit to the Department of Finance for comment, a standardized regulatory impact analysis, as provided. Existing law defines "major regulation" for purposes of the act to mean any proposed adoption, amendment, or repeal of a regulation subject to review by the office that will have an economic impact on California business enterprises and individuals in an amount exceeding \$50,000,000, as provided. Existing law establishes procedures for the adoption of emergency regulations, including requiring that the state agency make a finding that the adoption of a regulation or order of repeal is necessary to address an emergency, as defined. Under existing law, a regulation, amendment, or order of repeal adopted as an emergency regulatory action may only remain in effect for up to 180 days, unless the adopting agency complies with specified requirements. This bill would prohibit a state agency from taking final action to adopt a major regulation until certain requirements are met, including that after the state agency prepares a standardized regulatory impact analysis and submits the analysis to the Department of Finance, as described above, the state agency submits a proposal to the Legislature recommending legislation to authorize the adoption of the major regulation and the Legislature enacts a law expressly authorizing the state agency to adopt that major regulation. The bill, notwithstanding that prohibition, would authorize a state agency to adopt an emergency regulation that is a major regulation if the state agency complies with specified requirements governing the adoption of emergency regulations. The bill would prohibit the emergency regulation from being in effect more than 180 days, except that the state agency may twice readopt an emergency regulation that is the same or substantially equivalent to the emergency regulation previously adopted for a period not to exceed 90 days, if the state agency prepares a standardized regulatory impact analysis and submits the analysis to the Department of Finance for comment, as described above, and the state agency submits a proposal to the Legislature recommending legislation to authorize the adoption of the major regulation.

**AB 35** (**Alvarez D**) **Safe Drinking Water, Wildfire Prevention, Drought Preparedness, and Clean Air Bond Act of 2024: Administrative Procedure Act: exemption: program guidelines and selection criteria.**

**Summary:** Existing law, the Administrative Procedure Act, sets forth the requirements for the adoption, publication, review, and implementation of regulations by state agencies. The Safe Drinking Water, Wildfire Prevention, Drought Preparedness, and Clean Air Bond Act of 2024 (act), approved by the voters as Proposition 4 at the November 5, 2024, statewide general election, authorized the issuance of bonds in the amount of \$10,000,000,000 pursuant to the State General Obligation Bond Law to finance projects for safe drinking water, drought, flood, and water resilience, wildfire and forest resilience, coastal resilience, extreme heat mitigation, biodiversity and nature-based climate solutions, climate-smart, sustainable, and resilient farms, ranches, and working lands, park creation and outdoor access, and clean air programs. Existing law authorizes certain regulations needed to effectuate or implement programs of the act to be adopted as emergency regulations in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, as provided. Existing law requires the emergency regulations to be filed with the Office of Administrative Law and requires the emergency regulations to remain in effect until repealed or amended by the adopting state agency. This bill, notwithstanding the above, would exempt the adoption of regulations needed to effectuate or implement programs of the act from the requirements of the Administrative Procedure Act, as provided. The bill would require a state entity that receives funding to administer a competitive grant program established using the Administrative Procedure Act exemption to do certain things, including develop draft project solicitation and evaluation guidelines and to submit those guidelines to the Secretary of the Natural Resources Agency, except as provided. The bill would require the Secretary of the Natural Resources Agency to post an electronic form of the guidelines submitted by a state entity and the subsequent verifications on the

Natural Resources Agency's internet website. The bill would authorize the use of certain previously developed program guidelines and selection criteria for these purposes, as provided. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

**(Patterson R) California Renewables Portfolio Standard Program: local publicly owned electric utilities: large hydroelectric generation.** (Amended: 1/5/2026 [html](#) [pdf](#))

**Location:** 1/27/2026-S. RLS.

**Summary:** Under existing law, the California Renewables Portfolio Standard Program requires retail sellers and local publicly owned electric utilities to procure a minimum quantity of electricity products from eligible renewable energy resources during certain compliance periods up to December 31, 2030. Existing law provides that a local publicly owned electric utility is not required to procure a certain amount of eligible renewable energy resources if, during a year within those compliance periods, the local publicly owned electric utility receives more than 40% of its retail sales from large hydroelectric generation under an ownership agreement or contract in effect as of January 1, 2018. Existing law authorizes the State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission (Energy Commission) to establish appropriate multiyear compliance periods for local publicly owned electric utilities beyond December 31, 2030. This bill would provide that the provision related to the procurement of eligible renewable energy resources by local publicly owned electric utilities also applies to the compliance periods established by the Energy Commission.

**(Bennett D) Office of Emergency Services: state matching funds: water system infrastructure improvements.** (Amended: 8/29/2025 [html](#) [pdf](#))

**Location:** 9/11/2025-S. 2 YEAR

**Summary:** Existing law establishes, within the office of the Governor, the Office of Emergency Services (OES), under the direction of the Director of Emergency Services. Existing law charges the OES with coordinating various emergency activities within the state. The California Emergency Services Act, contingent upon an appropriation by the Legislature, requires the OES to enter into a joint powers agreement pursuant to the Joint Exercise of Powers Act with the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection to develop and administer a comprehensive wildfire mitigation program relating to structure hardening and retrofitting and prescribed fuel modification activities. Existing law authorizes the joint powers authority to establish financial assistance limits and matching funding or other recipient contribution requirements for the program, as provided. This bill, contingent upon appropriation by the Legislature, would establish the Rural Water Infrastructure for Wildfire Resilience Program within the OES for the distribution of state matching funds to urban wildland interface communities, as defined, in designated high fire hazard severity zones or very high fire hazard severity zones to improve water system infrastructure, as prescribed. The bill would require the OES to work in coordination with the Department of Water Resources, the State Water Resources Control Board, the Office of the State Fire Marshal, and other state entities as the OES determines to be appropriate, to achieve the purposes of the program. The bill would require the OES to develop criteria and a scoring methodology to prioritize the distribution of state matching funds provided under the program to rural communities based upon specified criteria.

**(Petrie-Norris D) The California Endangered Species Act: take of species: renewable electrical generation facilities.** (Amended: 5/6/2025 [html](#) [pdf](#))

**Summary:** The California Endangered Species Act prohibits the taking of an endangered, threatened, or candidate species, except as specified. Under the act, the Department of Fish and Wildlife may authorize the take of listed species by certain entities through permits or memorandums of understanding for specified purposes. The act allows take by permit if, among other things, the impact of the authorized take is fully minimized and mitigated. This bill would provide that if an at-risk species, as defined, becomes listed as an endangered, threatened, or candidate species, further authorization

or approval shall not be required for a take of that species, if specified conditions are met, including that the potential listing of the at-risk species was anticipated in a permit previously issued by the department for incidental take caused by a renewable electrical generation facility. The bill would authorize the department, in partnership with a permit applicant for an incidental take caused by a renewable electrical generation facility, to develop a research project that evaluates specified factors. The bill would authorize a research project reviewed and approved by the department to contribute to a renewable electrical generation project's mitigation, as provided. The bill would require the department to report to the Legislature specified information, including among other things, a report on each at-risk species authorized for take, as provided.

**[AB 748](#) (Harabedian D) Single-family and multifamily housing units: preapproved plans.**

(Amended: 1/5/2026 [html](#) [pdf](#))

**Status:** 1/27/2026-In Senate. Read first time. To Com. on RLS. for assignment.

**Location:** 1/27/2026-S. RLS.

**Summary:** Existing law, the Planning and Zoning Law, provides for the adoption and administration of zoning laws, ordinances, rules and regulations by counties and cities and the implementation of those general plans as may be in effect in those counties or cities. In that regard, existing law requires each local agency, by January 1, 2025, to develop a program for the preapproval of accessory dwelling unit plans. This bill would require each local agency, as defined, to develop a program for the preapproval of single-family and multifamily residential housing plans, whereby the local agency accepts single-family and multifamily plan submissions for preapproval and approves or denies the preapproval applications, as specified. The bill would require a large jurisdiction, as defined, to develop this program by July 1, 2027, and a small jurisdiction, as defined, to develop a program by January 1, 2029. The bill would require the local agency to post preapproved single-family or multifamily residential housing plans and the contact information of the applicant on the local agency's internet website. This bill would require a local agency to either approve or deny ministerially an application for a single-family or multifamily residential housing unit within 30 days if the lot meets certain conditions and the application utilizes specified plans that have been preapproved by the local agency or that are identical to a plan used in an application approved by the local agency. The bill would prohibit the preapproval program from applying to single-family or multifamily residential housing plans intended for use in certain communities and developments, as specified. This bill contains other existing laws.

**Summary:** Existing law provides for the regulation and supervision of dams and reservoirs exclusively by the state. Under existing law, a person who violates certain provisions related to the regulation and supervision of dams and reservoirs or of any approval, order, rule, regulation, or requirement of the Department of Water Resources is guilty of a misdemeanor, as specified. This bill would prohibit the release of stored water from a reservoir owned and operated by the United States in this state if the release is done under false pretenses, which the bill would define to mean a release of water from a reservoir owned and operated by the United States in a manner that is knowingly, designedly, and intentionally under any false or fraudulent representation as to the purpose and intended use of the water. The bill would authorize the State Water Resources Control Board or the Attorney General, as provided, to bring an action for injunctive relief for a violation of the above-described prohibition. By expanding the scope of a crime, the bill would impose a state-mandated local program. This bill contains other existing laws.

**Summary:** Existing law, the Information Practices Act of 1977, prescribes a set of requirements, prohibitions, and remedies applicable to agencies, as defined, with regard to their collection, storage, and disclosure of personal information, as defined. Existing law exempts from the provisions of the act counties, cities, any city and county, school districts, municipal corporations, districts, political subdivisions, and other local public agencies, as specified. This bill would recast those provisions to, among other things, remove that exemption for local agencies, and would revise and expand the definition of "personal information." The bill would make other technical, nonsubstantive, and

conforming changes. Because the bill would expand the duties of local officials, this bill would impose a state-mandated local program. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

**Summary:** Existing law establishes the Office of Land Use and Climate Innovation in the Governor's office for the purpose of serving the Governor and the Governor's cabinet as staff for long-range planning and research and constituting the comprehensive state planning agency. Existing law authorizes a local agency to finance infrastructure projects through various means, including by authorizing a city or county to establish an enhanced infrastructure financing district to finance public capital facilities or other specified projects of communitywide significance that provide significant benefits to the district or the surrounding community. This bill would require the office, upon appropriation by the Legislature, to establish the Infrastructure Gap-Fund Program to provide grants to local agencies for the development and construction of infrastructure projects, as defined, facing unforeseen costs after starting construction. The bill would authorize the office to provide funding for up to 20% of a project's additional projected cost, as defined, after the project has started construction, subject to specified conditions, including, among other things, that the local agency has allocated existing local tax revenue for at least 45% of the initially budgeted total cost of the infrastructure project. When applying to the program, the bill would require the local agency to demonstrate challenges with completing the project on time and on budget and how the infrastructure project helps meet state and local goals, as specified. The bill would require the office to develop guidelines to implement the program that establish the criteria by which grant applications will be evaluated and funded. The bill would make these provisions operative on January 1, 2030.

**Location:** 8/28/2025-A. 2 YEAR

**Summary:** Existing law prohibits a person from using any pipe, pipe or plumbing fitting or fixture, solder, or flux that is not lead free in the installation or repair of any public water system or any plumbing in a facility providing water for human consumption, except when necessary for the repair of leaded joints of cast iron pipes. Existing law requires a community water system to compile an inventory of known lead user service lines in use in its distribution system and identify areas that may have lead user service lines in use in its distribution system, as provided. This bill would require the owner of a public housing unit that is owned or managed by a city, county, city and county, or city, county, or city and county housing authority, to provide information to the residents of the public housing unit regarding any applicable existing program that offers free testing of the water for lead. Because a local government would be required to provide a higher level of service by implementing its provisions, this bill would impose a state-mandated local program. This bill contains other existing laws.

**Location:** 2/11/2026-S. N.R. & W.

**Summary:** Existing law requires the Wildfire and Forest Resilience Task Force, established by former Governor Edmund G. Brown, Jr., to develop a comprehensive implementation strategy to track and ensure the achievement of the goals and key actions identified in the state's "Wildfire and Forest Resilience Action Plan," as provided. Existing law requires, on or before March 1, 2026, and every 5 years thereafter, the task force to update the action plan. This bill would require the task force, on or before July 1, 2028, and in cooperation with the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment and the State Department of Public Health, to assess the health costs and impacts of high-severity wildfire smoke using existing wildfire smoke and health data, as provided. The bill would require the task force, in developing this assessment, to, among other things, develop a model to determine the approximate health benefits of achieving the goals identified in the action plan and make recommendations on how the action plan can increase its health benefits. The bill would authorize the task force to enter into contracts with an independent group to assist with this assessment. The bill would require the task force to include this assessment and additional actions to reduce the health

impact of smoke in the next update to the action plan, as provided.

**(Seyarto R) California Emergency Services Act: disaster recovery: wildfires.**

(Introduced: 1/21/2026 [html](#) [pdf](#).)

**Status:** 1/22/2026-From printer. May be acted upon on or after February 21.

**Location:** 1/21/2026-S. RLS.

**Summary:** Existing law, the California Emergency Services Act, authorizes the Governor to proclaim a state of emergency when specified conditions of disaster or extreme peril to the safety of persons and property exist, and authorizes the Governor to exercise certain powers in response to that emergency, including, but not limited to, suspending specified statutes, ordinances, orders, regulations, or rules. This bill would require the Department of Housing and Community Development, in consultation with other specified state agencies, within 30 days of a state of emergency declared by the Governor relating to a wildfire, to provide a report to the Governor and the Legislature identifying state permitting requirements that may unduly impede efforts to rebuild properties or facilities destroyed as a result of the state of emergency that should be considered for suspension. The bill would also require the department, in consultation with other specified state agencies, within 60 days of a state of emergency relating to a wildfire, to review and provide a report to the Governor and the Legislature with recommendations regarding any provision of the California Building Standards Code that should be suspended for specified projects in order to facilitate rapid, safe, and cost-effective rebuilding and recovery. The bill would further require the department, upon the declaration of a state of emergency relating to a wildfire, to coordinate with local governments to identify and recommend procedures to establish rapid permitting and approval processes to expedite the reconstruction or replacement of residential properties destroyed or damaged by the state of emergency, and would require the department, within 60 days of the state of emergency, to submit a report to the Governor and the Legislature with those recommendations. This bill, except as provided, would require, upon the Governor's declaration of a state of emergency relating to a wildfire, every state agency and local agency involved in postdisaster response, debris removal, reconstruction, housing, or land-use permitting to accept electronic submission of any application, form, plan set, appeal, or request for agency action related to recovery efforts for that state of emergency, as provided. By imposing new duties on local agencies, the bill would impose a state-mandated local program. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

### DISCUSSION

Mesa Water's governmental relations program includes monitoring local and regional political issues and policy-setting authorities (e.g., County of Orange, Orange County Local Agency Formation Commission). Attached is the Orange County Advocacy Report. At the Board's February 25, 2026 meeting, Mesa Water staff will provide a verbal report on any actionable, relevant and/or timely issues.

### FINANCIAL IMPACT

In Fiscal Year 2026, \$450,000 is budgeted for Water Policy Support Services; \$226,120 has been spent to date.

### COUNTY OF ORANGE UPDATES

#### *Governance, Legal, and Accountability*

##### **Supervisors Approve \$3.3 Million Airport Fire Settlement**

The Board of Supervisors approved a \$3.3 million settlement with victims of the 2025 Airport Fire, resolving claims related to debris removal and property damage. The agreement avoids prolonged litigation while addressing community impacts from the 23,000-acre blaze.

##### **Supervisors Raise Trash Rates**

The Board approved an increase in solid waste rates to cover rising operational costs and landfill fees. The adjustment, effective in 2026, will add approximately \$2–\$4 per month for residential customers.

##### **South OC Opposes Landfill Expansion**

South Orange County cities and residents voiced opposition to a proposed expansion of the Prima Deshecha Landfill, citing traffic, odor, and environmental concerns. The issue is under review.

##### **Andrew Do Loses Law License**

Imprisoned former Supervisor Andrew Do had his law license revoked by the State Bar for taking bribes in a 2025 corruption case. The disbarment is permanent.

#### *Health & Social Services*

##### **CalOptima CEO to Retire**

CalOptima CEO Michael Hunn announced he will retire at the end of 2026. A national search for a successor will begin soon.

##### **Measles Cases Reported in Orange County**

Health officials confirmed additional measles cases in January. The outbreaks are reportedly linked to unvaccinated travelers.

##### **Nonprofits Strained by Rising Demand**

OC nonprofits reported surging calls for food and housing assistance, with 211 hotline volume up significantly. Leaders cited federal funding cuts and economic pressures as key factors.



## *Energy & Infrastructure*

### **OC Power Authority Sues County for \$1 Million**

The Orange County Power Authority filed a breach of contract lawsuit against the county, seeking nearly \$1 million in damages related to energy procurement agreements.

### **South OC Battery Storage Project Halted**

A proposed 250 MW battery storage facility in South Orange County paused its application with the California Energy Commission. Developers are exploring alternative sites.

### **Express Lanes Expansion Likely**

County transportation officials indicated more express lanes are planned for Orange County freeways to address congestion, with studies underway for additional segments.

## **COSTA MESA AND NEWPORT BEACH UPDATES**

### **Costa Mesa Passes Self-Checkout Regulation**

The Costa Mesa City Council approved an ordinance requiring staffed self-checkout stands in grocery and drug stores to enhance security and protect jobs. The measure passed 6-0 and takes effect soon.

### **Costa Mesa Invests Opioid Settlement Funds**

The City Council allocated opioid settlement money toward recovery and prevention programs for the homeless, focusing on housing and treatment services.

### **Newport Beach Reverses Wave Park Approval**

The Newport Beach City Council rescinded its prior approval of the Snug Harbor Surf Park project after a petition with nearly 10,000 signatures forced a public vote. The future of the wave pool at the golf course remains uncertain.

### **Newport Beach Considers New Police Station Location**

City officials are evaluating a Civic Center park site for a new police headquarters after spending \$30.5 million on an alternative location. The shift aims to optimize costs and community access.

### **Newport Beach Tightens Spring Break Enforcement**

The City Council approved stricter fines and additional police patrols for spring break periods in March and April to curb unruly crowds, underage drinking, and noise complaints.



## **OTHER CITY AND SPECIAL DISTRICT UPDATES**

### **Anaheim City Manager Resigns**

Anaheim City Manager Jim Vanderpool resigned following closed-session discussions and transparency concerns. The council accepted his retirement plans amid ongoing scrutiny.

### **Anaheim Reviews Angel Stadium Future**

City staff were directed to explore next steps for Angel Stadium, including potential redevelopment or repairs after a walkway collapse.

### **Brea Olinda Unified School District Trustee Absent After Arrest**

A Brea Olinda trustee remained absent from board meetings following an arrest on child pornography charges. The district is reviewing removal procedures.

### **Huntington Beach Federal Trial on At-Large Voting Begins**

A federal trial started to determine if Huntington Beach's at-large voting system dilutes Latino representation. The city argued voters are fairly represented.

## **MESA WATER CUSTOMER UPDATES**

### **OC Fair and Event Center Announces 2026 Theme**

The OC Fair unveiled its 2026 theme, "Your Adventure Awaits!" for the July 17–August 16 event.

### **John Wayne Airport Reports Continued Passenger Growth**

In December 2025, the airport served 961,634 passengers, a 2.1% increase from December 2024 (941,651 passengers). Year-to-date for 2025 totaled 11,369,865 passengers, up 2.5% from 2024. In November 2025, 910,916 passengers (a 3.2% increase from November 2024) traveled.

### **Segerstrom Center for the Arts Continues Musical Runs**

"The Notebook" musical runs through February 8, and the revival of "The Wiz" concluded a successful engagement.

### **South Coast Plaza Kicks Off Year of the Horse Celebrations**

South Coast Plaza kicked off the Year of the Horse events with special decorations and programming.



## **POLITICAL UPDATES**

### **Supreme Court Allows Prop 50 Maps to Stand**

The U.S. Supreme Court declined to block California's Proposition 50 redistricting maps, allowing them to remain in place for the 2026 elections and potentially beyond.

### **Newsom Visits OC to Unveil Jobs Plan**

Governor Newsom traveled to Orange County to highlight regional job creation initiatives and infrastructure investments.

### **California Economic Growth Middling**

California's economy grew 4.5% in the third quarter, ranking middling nationally despite strong job gains in some sectors.

### **Drought Officially Over, Focus Shifts to Storage**

State officials declared the drought over but emphasized the need for new water storage projects to prepare for future dry periods.

### **Recycling Targets Remain Elusive**

California is far from meeting its recycling goals, with officials acknowledging the targets may need adjustment.

### **Fewer People Moving to California**

Despite perceptions of an exodus, data show relatively few people are choosing to relocate to the state, with domestic migration remaining low.
