CONSTRUCTION NOTICE

Wilson Street Pipeline Replacement Project Scheduled to Begin

As part of its Capital Improvement Program, Mesa Water District (Mesa Water®) will replace the underground steel pipeline on Wilson Street from the Harbor Boulevard intersection to the Newport Boulevard intersection in Costa Mesa.

The existing pipeline, installed 70 years ago, is about 4,580 linear feet in length and will be replaced by a new 12-inch polyvinyl chloride (PVC) pipeline.

Construction is scheduled to begin in August and will be completed by Spring 2022. Following the completion of Mesa Water's Wilson Street Pipeline Replacement Project, the City of Costa Mesa will begin resurfacing Wilson Street.

Project Activity During Construction

- Prior to pipeline construction, survey work and potholing activity are required to locate underground utilities
- Open trench construction
- Excavation and backfill work
- Deliveries of materials and use of construction equipment

Potential Impacts

Safety is Mesa Water's top priority. There will be no disruption in water service to customers. Potential impacts include:

- Temporary lane closure during potholing activity and in work areas
- Temporary sidewalk closures and parking restrictions
- Temporary bus stop closures or relocations
- Minimal noise, dust and vibration during work activities

Traffic Management & Access

- Through-traffic on Wilson Street will be accessible and/or detoured
- Driveway access, trash and delivery services will not be affected

Background

Mesa Water District provides potable (drinking) water for a population of about 110,000 within an 18-square-mile service area that includes Costa Mesa, portions of Newport Beach and portions of unincorporated Orange County.
